Long awaited expansion finally begins...

2010 was an exciting year with plans to renovate and expand the library finally getting underway. When construction of the new Patterson Town Court began, the library Board of Trustees and Director Patti Haar began their search for an architect to spear-head the expansion project. The library bought the current building on Route 311 in 2007, and shared the 7,500 square foot space with the court until the new court house opened in early 2011.

Lothrop Associates in Valhalla was chosen to design the new library and has created a cost-effective plan to meet the community's needs and demands. With no existing mortgage on the building, the library will use the equity to secure a loan with Putnam County Savings Bank. Combined with funds from grants, savings, tax dollars and fundraising, the plans create additional public spaces for people of all ages.

Residents will be asked to support a conservative budget proposition on the November 2011 ballot to fund operating expenses and the expansion. Construction is slated to begin this summer with plans to keep the library open throughout the project. Expansion updates, photos, and program information will be available on the library website, Facebook page, and through e-News alerts.

The economic downturn affected how we did business in 2010. With **73,706** visitors last year we saw sharp increases across the board. Circulation transactions grew to 69,830 while attendance at programs reached 8.029. With many of our local families facing financial difficulties, we responded with programming and services to help deal with the real issues faced by so many.
